FILING PETITION FOR NAME CHANGE OF AN ADULT

This guide is for informational purposes only and the accuracy of this information is not guaranteed. This information is not legal advice and is not a substitute for legal advice. Court Clerks cannot give you legal advice.

A civil case for name change of an adult begins when the petitioner files a petition with the Court on behalf of themselves. The petition is a statement of the “the right sought to be declared or enforced and a statement of what relief is sought.” PTC 4.08.080.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE effective November 30, 2020, only enrolled adult Puyallup Tribal Members, regardless of location, may petition for their name change before Puyallup Tribal Court. You must confirm your enrollment status in order for your petition to be accepted by the Tribal Court.

1. How do I file a civil petition?

STEP 1: Read this guide and the petition carefully before completing.

STEP 2: Gather Documentation/Information.

Locate documents and information that will help you complete the petition. This includes specific *attachments* required with your filing.

Please be aware, it is your responsibility to provide the Court with proof of your identification and enrollment status. The Court cannot independently verify such information. If you need a Tribal Identification card, please contact the Enrollment Department at (253) 573-7849 or Enrollment@PuyallupTribe-nsn.gov.

STEP 3: Complete the Petition.

It is important to complete the petition with as much detail as possible so the presiding judge has enough information to conduct an initial hearing. Accurately providing all the requested information will help prevent unnecessary delays in the process.

*If, for genuine safety reasons, you are requesting your residential address be **confidential**, then follow the appropriate instructions on the ‘Statement of Address’ form to ensure that your address remains confidential.*

STEP 4: File the Petition

To start your case with the Court, you must file all necessary information with the Court, located at 1451 East 31st St. Tacoma, WA 98404. The Court is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., closed on holidays and may also be closed for inclement weather and other administrative purposes as needed. Please see the Court’s website, <http://www.Puyallup-Tribe.com/Court/>, for up-to-date information on Court closures.

Step 4.1: Submit filings to the Court Clerk

Completed Petition for Name Change of an Adult;

Completed ‘Statement of Address’ form;

- All required *attachments*;
- Any supplemental documents;
- If applicable*, a completed and signed ‘Notice of Appearance’ form for your attorney/advocate.

Step 4.2: Pay the filing fee to the Court Clerk

- \$20.00 filing fee must be paid in exact amount and is non-refundable. The Court accepts cash, check, or money order.

Step 4.3: Receive from the Court Clerk

- receipt for your filing fee;
- file-stamped copies of your filings; and
- enter-stamped notice of hearing with the initial hearing date.

2. What happens after you file your petition?

If the presiding judge determines your petition is not complete or a pre-filing requirement is not met, then your petition cannot move forward until you provide the Court with the required amendments. The presiding judge may provide you leave of Court to amend your petition or may reject your petition. If you do not provide the Court with the required amendments, then the presiding judge will dismiss your case and will detail whether you have met the pre-filing requirements to re-file.

If the presiding judge determines your petition is complete, then the Court will issue an order to publish in a newspaper of general circulation for three consecutive weeks, at the Court’s expense, notice of your Petition for Name Change directing all interested persons of the opportunity to appear before the Court at the initial hearing to show cause as to why your name change should not be granted.

3. What happens at the initial hearing?

You must show up at the initial hearing. If you fail to appear, the presiding judge will likely dismiss your case and you will have to re-file if you wish to proceed with your name change.

The Court will record the initial hearing and all subsequent hearings pursuant to Puyallup Tribal Code 4.16.230. The presiding judge will call the case to order on the record and cover some preliminary information with the parties. The parties will have the opportunity to be heard. Following, the presiding judge will make a decision on how the case will proceed.

4. What happens after the hearing?

What happens after the initial hearing depends on what the presiding judge orders. Therefore, it is important to read any order issued by the judge and understand its contents because the order will outline the next step(s) in the process.
