

Puyallup Tribe: Oral History Use Policy

The Puyallup Tribe's Historic Preservation Department has been tasked by the Puyallup Tribal Council to record and compile oral histories, photographs, recordings, and artifacts relating to the Puyallup Tribe's history. The Historic Preservation Department will use the collected stories and media for educational purposes and may also be used to produce a documentary film, podcast, non-fiction book, museum exhibit, and social media content to be shared with the public.

What to expect:

As an interviewee, you will have the opportunity to work with the Historic Preservation Department (HPD) to record your personal recollections of important historic or life events. The HPD may choose to use an audio recorder, a video recorder or both for the purpose of preserving your oral history. HPD staff may also utilize the use of photographs, documents, or videos to guide the interview if deemed appropriate. Upon completion of the interview(s), the HPD staff will begin to transcribe the interview into a written document. Once the transcription is complete it will be double checked for accuracy. Prior to using your interview or related media, you, the interviewee, will be given the opportunity to review the written transcript and make any changes or restrictions to portions of the oral history at that time. The HPD will assume no changes or restrictions are to be made to the transcript if after two weeks (14 days) the interviewee has not submitted the request to modify, therefore, finalizing the interview process.
