Indigenous Peoples in Washington

Map Description

The map serves as a general reference for the indigenous peoples located in what is now the State of Washington, USA.

The map depicts the present-day Native American tribal entities who are based in Washington, whether or not they are currently recognized by the United States government. Mapped locations for Tribes are approximate. Tribes are mapped by Land Area Representation (LAR - purple polygons) or by generalized location (pink triangles). The BIA's LAR dataset "illustrates land areas for Federally-recognized tribes". Land Areas may include Indian Reservations, Tribally owned lands, Trust lands, fee lands, and off-reservation Trust lands. There are Tribes which possess multiple types of Land Areas. There may be Tribes without any Land Areas. Note that the map/lists focus on current Tribal entities; the concept of Indigenous People(s) in the past was often lived very differently. Not all Indigenous Peoples | Nations (past and present) are represented here.
