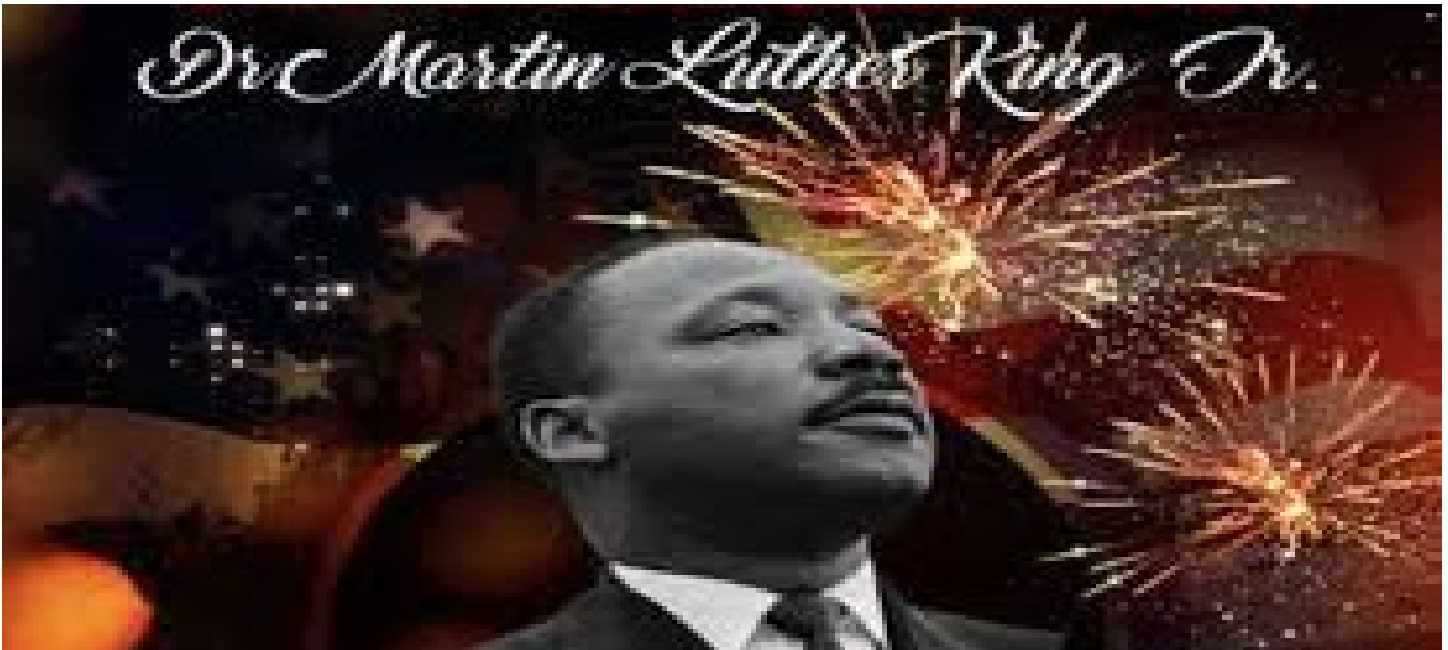

You can authorize the payment to be processed that day or an upcoming date of your choosing. We will still be accepting payments at the office. This option will make it easier for all residents to pay their rent on time, as it will eliminate your need to come down to the office.



SILVERFISH

SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING...

Every month we will focus on specific pests that plague residents here in the Northwest. This month we will focus on Silverfish. These insects inhabit places in your home that are humid and moist such as bathrooms, closets, or under the sink.

Silver fish are pests because they eat personal belongings such as wallpaper, books, and envelopes. They also like anything that has adhesive on it. These insects will end up damaging your items over time. They can also damage bedding that may be stored away.

To prevent Silverfish from being a problem you want to keep all the food in your cupboards in sealed containers. You also want to make sure that your house is free of dust and food particles that may be laying around. Make sure you're storing clothes in a dry environment and ventilate rooms that may get warm or moist. Silverfish are also deterred by the smell of citrus fruits. You can use orange/lemon peels around areas of concern or spray the area with a mixture of lemon juice and water.
