#### CARPET BEETLES

SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING...

Every month we will focus on specific pests that plague residents here in the Northwest. This month we will focus on Carpet Beetles. These insects inhabit places in your home that are have available food sources to them such as fabric and animal products.

Carpet Beetle larvae eat any organic fabric (wool) and animal products (feathers, fur) leaving visible holes/worn areas in your upholstery/items. This can be mistaken for a moth issue instead of a carpet beetle problem. Aside from seeing the effects of the carpet beetle throughout your home, you will see the furry brown larvae on walls and next to window sills.

To prevent carpet beetles from being a problem you want to keep all items laundered ad stored in containers that can keep the beetles out. Regular vacuuming and cleaning of these items will also deter the beetle eggs from hatching. Clean around baseboards, floor vents, and ducts. These pests can also live on the carcasses of other dead bugs. Cleaning out all light fixtures of dead bugs will also help with prevention. Dry- cleaning or hot laundering can kill any eggs or larvae that may be present.

Aside from making the property look unaesthetically pleasing, this clutter is perfect for pests to shelter in from the cold. It is each residents' responsibility to keep these areas clean and orderly. All items such as bikes, barbeques, and lawn furniture need to stored correctly when not in use. We also want to make sure that you are cleaning the lint trap on your dryers. This will prevent it from over-heating and catching fire.
