FLEAS

SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING...

Every month we will focus on specific pests that plague residents here in the Northwest. This month we will focus on fleas. With the weather getting warmer you will notice more fleas as their numbers increase drastically.

The most common flea is the cat flea. In spite of its' name these fleas also attack dogs and humans. Fleas in the home are usually caused by a pet infestation that can lead to humans being effected as well.

To ensure that your house is free from fleas regular cleaning must be done and flea control products administered to the pet in the home. Cleaning the pets bedding, washing the pet in flea shampoos, and having the pet wear a flea collar can eliminate or keep the flea pollutions down.

Keeping a clean house can help tremendously in keeping the fleas out. There is an attachment that you can look at to reference for flea prevention. Please report all signs to the housing department as soon as you see them. This will ensure that it is taken care of before it becomes an issue.
