DUMP REMINDER!!!

Just a reminder that residents will be charged for removal of any tenant property. This is stated in the Maintenance Policy, Section M., 11., xi.: "Removal of Tenant Property to Dump: All cases when left by Tenant. Chairs, small tables, small items, overstuffed chairs, mattresses, box springs, chest or rockers, davenport, couch, washing machine or dryer and clothes, or other material left by Tenant. Charge: \$25.00 per hour, plus any applicable dumping fees". Any questions or concerns please contact your RS Specialist.

OPOSSUMS

SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING...

Every month we will focus on specific pests that plague residents here in the Northwest. This month we will focus on Opossums. Although they may help with rodent and carrion eater populations; they may still pose a significant threat of spreading disease/parasites.

Opossums are nocturnal marsupials. They may look for food sources around gardens and garbage cans. This is why it is very important to make sure trash isn't left out for pests. Trash must also be placed in the garbage containers and not left outside of them. DO NOT feed them!!! This may create a situation where they are not afraid of humans and become aggressive.

Just like any other pest the key to keeping them away is keeping the community clean and tidy. Make sure your trash isn't left outside, especially at night. Also making sure you're not leaving pet food out.

Although opossums can be beneficial in keeping certain pests in check, the environment they like to live creates the perfect place for those pests to exist. Keeping a clean property will keep ALL of them away.

MAINTENANCE CORNER

With spring and summer upon us there will be an increased number of wasps, hornets, and yellow jackets around. To combat this, we have set up traps to keep the numbers down and our residents safe. These traps are bright yellow in color. Make sure if you see these traps, PLEASE LEAVE THEM ALONE. These will cause irritation to the eyes and skin if touched. They will also have the pests trapped inside them. The traps will be up until the winter months. If you see any of these traps removed or fallen please contact maintenance.
